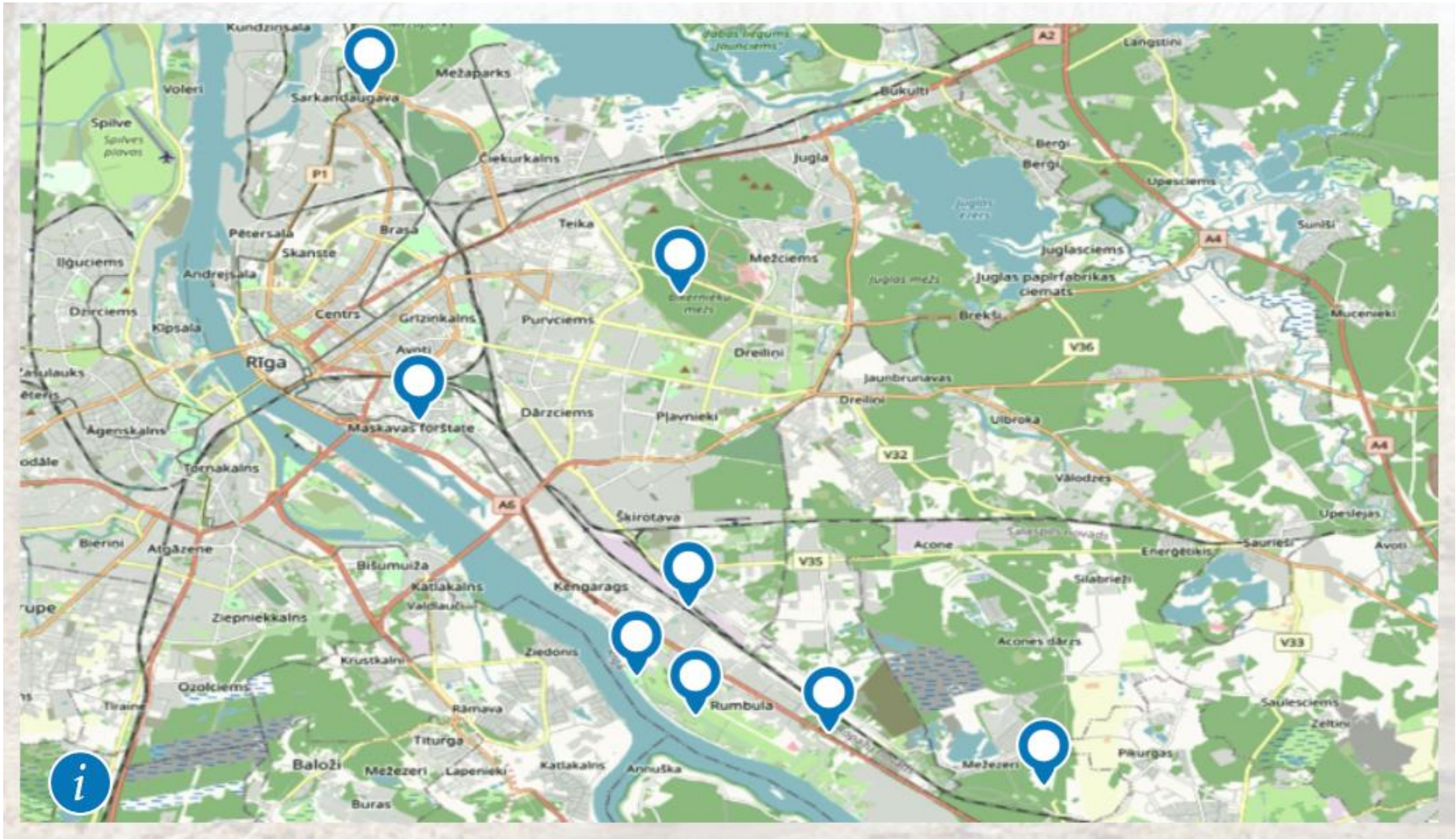

JEWS OF LATVIA 1941-1945: NAMES AND FATES

<http://NAMES.LU.LV>

- Database, tracing fates of Latvian Jews shortly before and during the Holocaust
- Based on national population census of 1935, and 400+ additional sources
- Includes those, who were listed as Jews by ethnicity or religion
- Includes those, who have died of natural causes, emigrated, or were deported or executed by the Soviets
- Entries can be and are updated
- The writing of the surnames is more or less uniform, and uses German-based spelling
- In the future there are plans to link entries on relatives

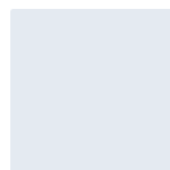

Ape Municipality, the Ape Brethren Cemetery



Location of the monuments:

Latitude: 57.543628

Longitude: 26.692869

The Nazi troops entered Ape on 11 July 1941, and on the very same day local self-defenders killed 11 residents of Ape in the Jaši Pine Forest – among them two Jewish women – Zilya Ratut and Anna Gruzin. Soon afterwards all Jews of the town were arrested. Mass-scale murdering of Jews took place on 13 August, when all arrested Jews were taken to Krustceļa (Meža) Graveyard (approximately 3km from Ape), where the Latvian SD unit ("Arājs' Commando") together with local self-defenders shot them.

In the 1960s the victims were reinterred from the site of murder in the Jaši Pine Forest and at the Krustceļa Graveyard in the Ape Brethren Cemetery. In 1991 Wulf Faiwelsohn, survivor of the Holocaust, erected a separate monument at the place of reinterment to commemorate members of the Faiwelsohn's family, and a memorial plaque with an inscription in Latvian "96 Jews Victims of Fascist Terror of 1941". In 2005 this memorial plaque was resorted by society "Memoriāls", when the Ape Brethren Cemetery was reconstructed.

- Partially based on *Book of Remembrance: The German, Austrian and Czechoslovakian Jews deported to the Baltic States/ Compiled by Wolfgang Scheffler and Diana Schulle (2003)*
- Lists both those, who perished, and those, who survived
- Only 563 of ca. 25 thousand deportees included
- Does not include deportees from Hungary (summer 1944)
- Uses documents and memoirs
- Emphasis on defining fate between deportation and death (or transit to Stutthof or other camp in Poland or Germany)
- WordPress website, mostly operated by “Gedenkdieners”

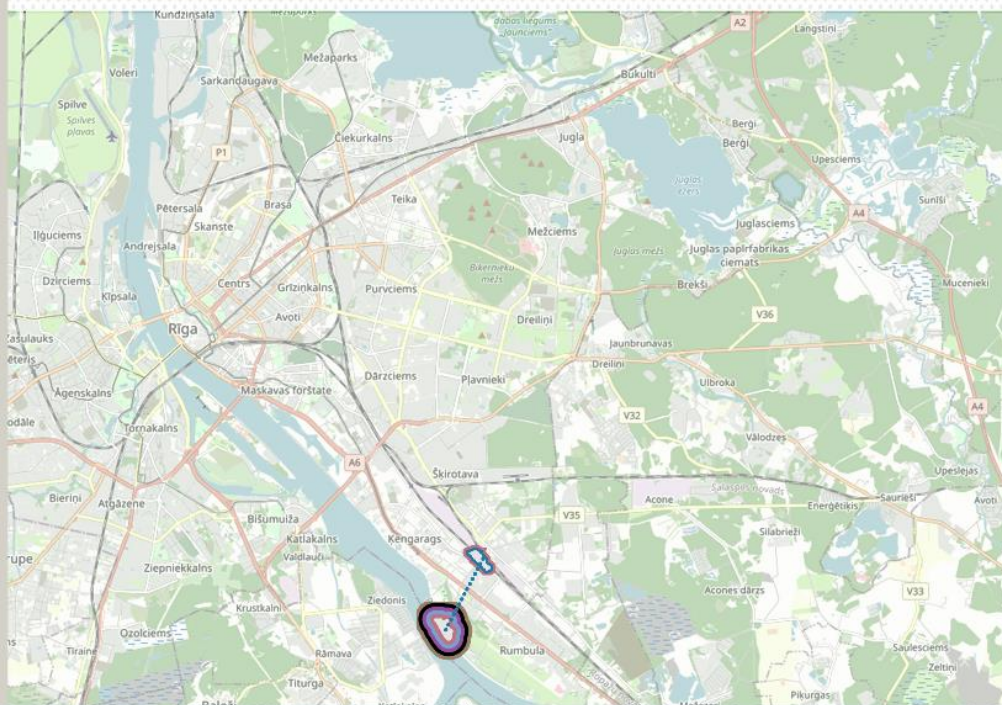

THE MAPS

The 1,013 deportees from Stuttgart arrive at Škirotava freight station, are greeted by a retinue of German SS officers and Latvian guards from the Araijs Kommando, and are forced to march to Jungfernhof. One woman breaks her leg on the march to Jungfernhof.

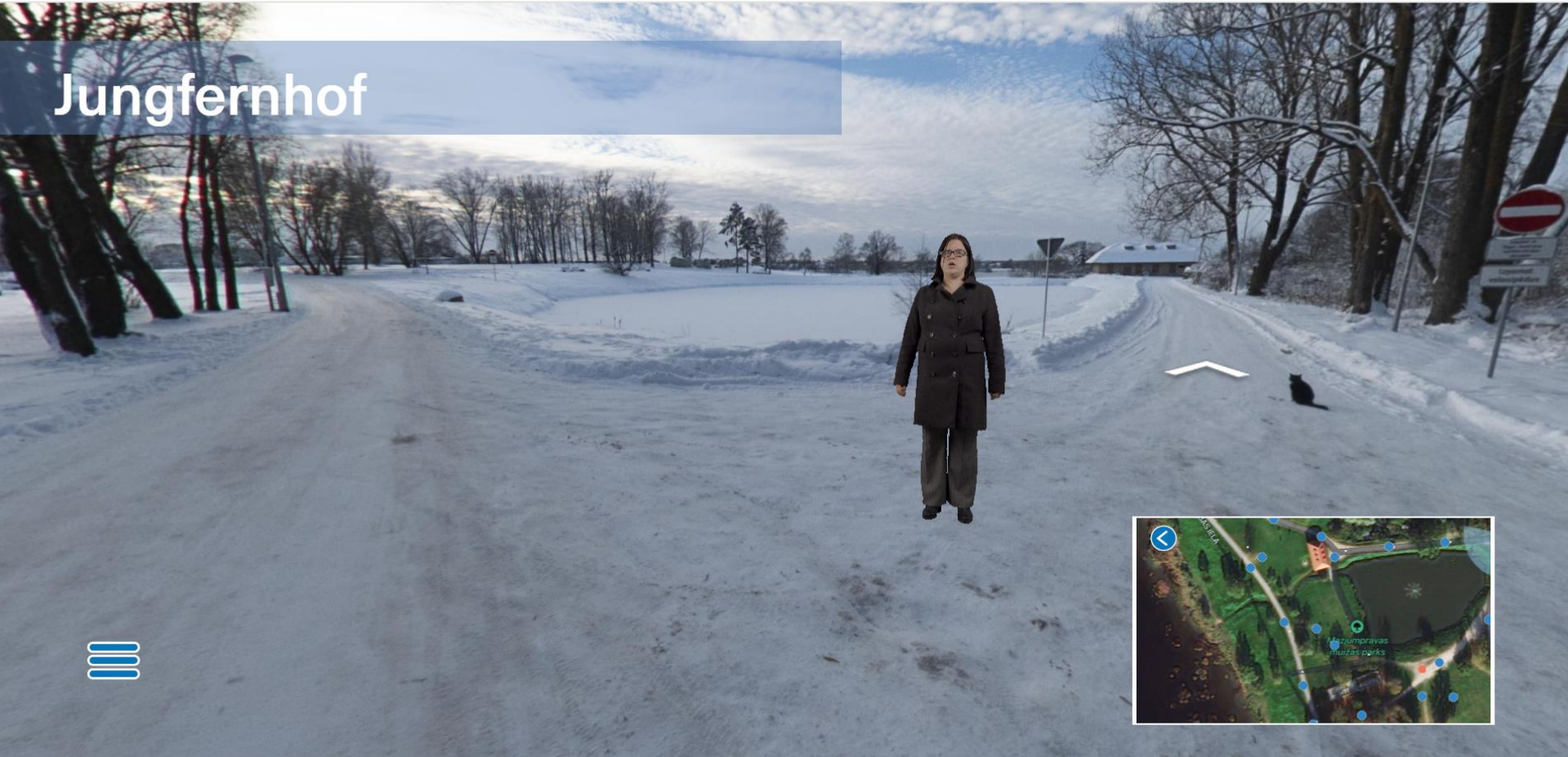

Jungfernhof



SS Estate Jungfernhof was the first Nazi concentration camp in Latvia. 3,984 German and Austrian Jews were sent to Jungfernhof – whole families – of whom 148 individuals survived the Holocaust.

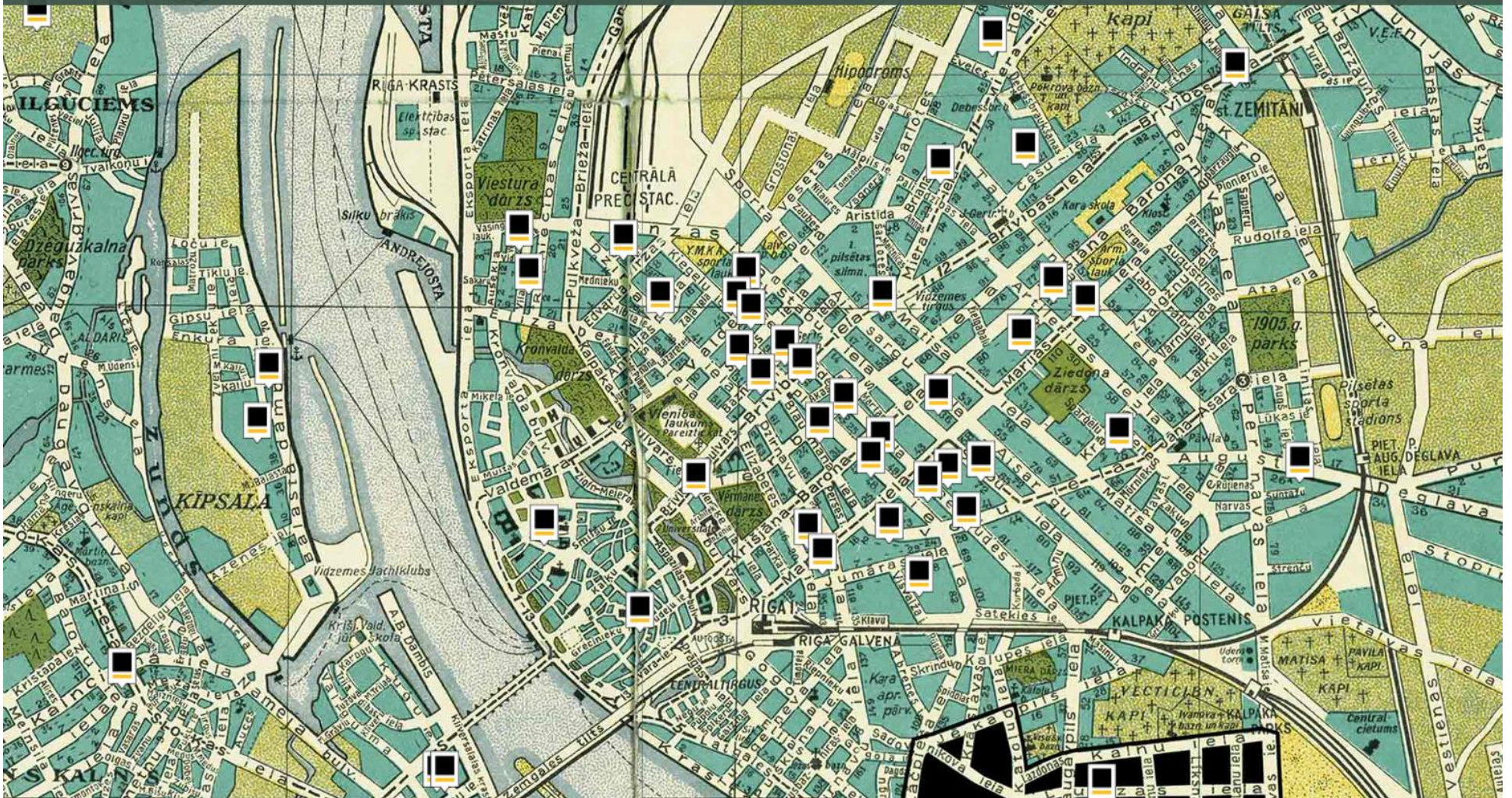


PAGRĪDES RĪGA (UNDERGROUND RIGA): MAPPING RESCUE OF JEWS DURING THE HOLOCAUST
