1. Museums and Institutions

[Estonian Jewish Museum](#), located in Tallinn, is dedicated to the history of the Jewish community in Estonia from the 19th century to the present day. It has a permanent exhibition, a library, and both physical and digital archives. The museum is situated within the Estonian Jewish Community Center.

- **Educational Value:** The museum's website has a dedicated [portal](#) for teachers that offers materials for teaching about the Holocaust, Jewish history in Estonia, and Judaism as part of the national school curriculum. They also organize educational excursions on these topics for Estonian schools.

2. Other Sources

Estonian International Commission for the Investigation of Crimes Against Humanity, also known as the [Max Jakobson Commission](#), this body was established by the President of Estonia in 1998. It has published reports on the German occupation of Estonia from 1941–1944. The report from 2001 is available in English.

- **Educational Value:** The reports provide a historical and documented account of the occupation and its events. The information can be used for in-depth research and to provide a factual foundation for teaching about the period.

Estonian Holocaust Sites [Map Application](#) This interactive web-based application shows the locations of various Holocaust sites in Estonia.

- **Educational Value:** The map provides a visual and geographical context for the history of the Holocaust in Estonia, making it easier for students to understand the scale and location of key sites.
